over recent years the increasing scope of a s byatt s work as a writer has fostered a corresponding breadth of academic interest both in the traditional field of literary criticism and beyond the discipline among scholars of the natural and social sciences most of this research has been limited to conference papers interviews and articles scattered across a wide variety of journals and has examined only the most basic critical issues related to byatt s writing this volume provides the first substantive inquiry into her fiction and spans virtually the entire body of her work by advancing multiple and mutually informative theoretical frameworks for a critical appreciation of byatt s work as a writer this book surveys and furthers the growing critical interest in her fiction contending that byatt s work renders the boundaries between criticism and fiction highly permeable the responses to her work gathered in this volume purposely blur the demarcation lines between the different schools of thought

currently fighting for critical supremacy in doing so they explore the narrative and intellectual terrain mapped out by one of britain s most imaginative novelists and contribute to current debates on the contemporary novel in england

mary wollstonecraft wrote these two novellas at the beginning and end of her years of writing and political activism though written at different times they explore some of the same issues ideals of femininity as celebrated by the cult of sensibility the unequal education of women and domestic subjugation mary counters the contemporary trend of weak emotional heroines with the story of an intelligent and creative young woman who educates herself through her close friendships with men and women darker and more overtly feminist the wrongs of woman is set in an insane asylum where a young woman has been wrongly imprisoned by her husband by presenting the novellas in light of such texts as wollstonecraft s letters her polemical and educational prose similar works by other feminists and political reformists the literature of sentiment and contemporary medical texts this edition encourages an appreciation of the complexity and sophistication of wollstonecraft s writing goals as a radical feminist in the 1790s

John Fowles's Fiction and the Poetics of Postmodernism 1992

written by leading design philosopher tony fry writing design fiction relocating a city in crisis is both an introduction to the power of design fiction in the design process and a novella length work of fiction in itself telling the dramatic story of the relocation of the city of harshon set in the near future harshon a delta city is facing environmental catastrophe due to rising sea levels consequently a decision is made to relocate the entire city inland a diverse cast of voices including an architect a journalist an economist a construction worker and residents narrate the extraordinary challenges and complexities which follow this work presents a real world scenario which in coming decades will face many of the world s cities the fictional format provides a novel way of exploring the very serious inherent technical social political economic and cultural challenges the story provides a rehearsal of the design challenges which are likely to face architects planners and designers in an uncertain global future design fiction is a fast growing area within design and architecture increasingly deployed as a serious methodology by designers as a tool in scenario planning writing design fiction takes the practice to a higher level conceptually and theoretically but also practically the book is divided into four parts with the fictional narrative bookended by further critical analysis part one shows how a critique of existing modes of design fiction can lead to more grounded and critical thinking and practice part three critically reflects on the narrative while part four presents the practical application of the second order design fiction approach this book demonstrates the value of a more developed mode of design fiction to students professional designers and architects across the breadth of design practices as well as to other disciplines interested in the future of cities

Mary, A Fiction and The Wrongs of Woman, or Maria 2012-04-05

form and image in the fiction of henry miller is a study of allegorical patterns in miller s major fiction the cities characters and scenes of his fictional world are described as events in the development and integration of the self the analysis which draws on several disciplines for its insights especially on the psychoanalytic studies of c g jung is a deliberate and detailed attempt to explore the extent to which such insights can successfully support and assist a literary analysis consequently no biographical context for the explications is provided neither miller s knowledge of psychoanalytic theory nor the details of his personal life are the concern of this study the focus is on the fiction itself and the actions of the mind it may dramatize the great miller cities of paris and new york are seen as projections or images in which the psychic landscape of the developing self has been given fictional form the characters are not discussed as characters familiar to readers of the novel but as figures of the mind which borrow only their superficial characteristics from the twentieth century scene the nature of their form shows that many of them are aspects of one archetype against which the i of millers fiction struggles the development of this i provides the allegorical dimension in the fictional world of miller and becomes the subject of his confession the frankly described sexual adventures that prevented many of miller s works from being distributed in this country until fairly recently are identified as parts of the archetypal world other analyses can satisfactorily defend miller s obscenity but recognizing the relationship between the sexual imagery and other archetypal images provides a reading that reveals the allegorical character of his fiction and the unity of its action

Desire and Domestic Fiction 1987-05-07

this collection of essays offers a comprehensive examination of texts that traditionally have been excluded from the main corpus of the ancient greek novel and confined to the margins of the genre such as the life of aesop the life of alexander the great and the acts of the christian martyrs through comparison and contrast intertextual analysis and close examination the boundaries of the dichotomy between the fringe vs the canonical or erotic novel are explored and so the generic identity of the texts in each group is more clearly outlined the collective outcome brings the fringe from the periphery of scholarly research to the centre of critical attention and provides methodological tools for the exploration of other fringe texts

the continuing cultural encounters of the americas between european and indigenous cultures and between scientific materialism and premodern supernaturalism have originated new narrative forms while supernatural short fiction of the americas belongs to the broad category of the fantastic which is generally approached synchronically reading audiences of the past 200 years have shifted their beliefs about the supernatural several times while nineteenth century readers understood science as real and the supernatural as imaginary modern audiences recognize both as inaccurate a shift which allows authors of supernatural fiction to celebrate premodern indigenous beliefs which were once disdained by a materialist culture this book situates supernatural short fiction of the americas within the changing cultural and epistemological contexts of the last 200 years and explores how authors have drawn upon a wealth of indigenous traditions the book begins with a discussion of theories of the supernatural and the fantastic it then looks at some of the first encounters of european and native american supernatural beliefs and points to the common elements of these early traditions the volume next focuses on american literature of the nineteenth century which has a complex fusion of materialist biases and metaphysical fascinations the final portion of the book gives greater attention to spanish american literature and the blending of the supernatural with attitudes of nostalgia and uncertainty

Fiction on the Fringe 2009

the presidents of american fiction brings together american literature history and political science to explore the most influential fictionalized accounts of the presidency from the early 19th century to the time of trump of late popular understandings of the presidency are being radically re written consider for example the distinctive myths that accompanied the ascent of the obama and trump administrations and many readers of all stripes are radically reimagining the office and its holder placing these changes within a broader cultural context michael j blouin investigates narratives involving fictional presidents from the supposedly factual to the outright fantastical within their distinct literary and historical moments the author considers representative texts including works penned by james fenimore cooper from the jacksonian moment gore vidal in the age of nixon and vietnam and philip roth in the neoliberal period through detailed readings that question how american presidents function as characters within the popular imagination this book examines the presidency as a complex ever evolving trope and in so doing enhances our appreciation of american literature s inextricable link with american politics

German Elements in the Fiction of George Eliot, Gissing, and Meredith 1979

in the half century before walter scott s waverley dozens of popular novelists produced historical fictions for circulating libraries this book examines eighty five popular historical novels published between 1762 and 1813 looking at how the conventions of the genre developed through a process of imitation and experimentation

The Life and Times of Major Fiction 1986

in schools of fiction morgan day frank considers a bizarre but integral feature of the modern educational experience that teachers enthusiastically teach literary works that have terrible things to say about school from ishmael s insistence in herman melville s moby dick that a whale ship was my yale college and my harvard to the unnamed narrator s expulsion from his southern college in ralph ellison s invisible man the most frequently taught books in the english curriculum tend to be those that cast the school as a stultifying and inhumane social institution why have educators preferred the anti scholasticism of the american romance tradition to the didacticism of sentimentalists why have they organized african american literature as a discursive category around texts that despaired of the post reconstruction institutional system why did they start teaching novels that literary form whose very nature in mikhaïl bakhtin s words is not canonic reading literature in class is a paradoxical undertaking that according to day frank has proved foundational to the development of american formal education over the last two centuries allowing the school to claim access to a social world external to itself by drawing attention to the transformative effect literature has had on the school schools of fiction challenges some of our core assumptions about the nature of cultural administration and the place of english in the curriculum the educational system day frank argues has depended historically on the cultural objects whose existence it is ordinarily thought to govern and the academic subject it is ordinarily thought to have marginalized

this book explores the power of the map in fiction and its centrality to meaning from treasure island to winnie the pooh

Experiments in the Novel: Henry James's Fiction, 1896-1901 1961

many readers are unaware of the vast universe of latin american science fiction which has its roots in the 18th century and has flourished to the present day because science fiction is part of latin american popular culture it reflects cultural and social concerns and comments on contemporary society while there is a growing body of criticism on latin american science fiction most studies treat only a single author or work this reference offers a broad overview of latin american science fiction included are alphabetically arranged entries on 70 latin american science fiction writers while some of these are canonical figures others have been largely neglected since much of science fiction has been written by women many women writers are profiled each entry is prepared by an expert contributor and includes a short biography a discussion of the writer s works and primary and secondary bibliographies the volume closes with a general bibliography of anthologies and criticism

The Fiction of P.H. Newby 1964

this book shows how early women novelists from aphra behn to mary davys drew on debates about the self generated by the scientific revolution to establish the novel as a genre fascinated by the problematic idea of a unified self underpinning modes of thinking female novelists innovated narrative structures to interrogate this idea

the book provides highlights on the key concepts and trends of evolution in history of fiction in china as one of the series of books of china classified histories

The Supernatural in Short Fiction of the Americas 2001-08-30

this study contextualizes magical realism within current debates and theories of postcoloniality and examines the fiction of three of its west african pioneers syl cheney coker of sierra leone ben okri of nigeria and kojo laing of ghana brenda cooper explores the distinct elements of the genre in a west african context and in relation to a range of global expressions of magical realism from the work of gabriel garcia marquez to that of salman rushdie wider contemporary trends in african writing with particular attention to how the realism of authors such as chinua achebe and wole soyinka has been connected with nationalist agendas this is a fascinating and important work for all those working on african literature magical realism or postcoloniality

this rich volume is dedicated to the astounding south african writer and literary critic lewis nkosi 1936 2010 in this book nkosi s celebrated one act play the black psychiatrist is published together with its unpublished sequel flying home a play on the satirically fictionalized inauguration of mandela as south african president critical appraisals tributes and recollections by scholars and friends reflect on the beat of his writing and life an ideal volume for those encountering lewis nkosi for the first time as well as for those already devoted to his work edited by astrid starck a literary scholar and dag henrichsen a historian much has happened to me that is worth narrating worth celebrating in spite of the regrets and sorrows of exile my life began under apartheid until i attained the age of 22 and then subsequently lived in many places and societies in central africa britain the united states poland and during a brief sojourn in france and finally in switzerland lewis nkosi in memoirs of a motherless child

British Historical Fiction before Scott 2010-04-09

the marriage of philosophy and fiction in the first third of spain s twentieth century was a fertile one it produced some truly notable offspring novels that cross genre boundaries to find innovative forms and treatises that fuse literature and philosophy in new ways in her illuminating interdisciplinary study of spanish fiction of the silver age roberta johnson places this important body of spanish literature in context through a synthesis of social literary and philosophical history her examination of the work of miguel de unamuno pio baroja azorin ramon perez de ayala juan ramon jimenez gabriel miro pedro salinas rosa chacel and benjamin jarnes brings to light philosophical frictions and debates and opens new interpersonal and intertextual perspectives on many of the period s most canonical novels johnson reformulates the traditional discussion of generations and isms by viewing the period as an intergenerational complex in which writers with similar philosophical and personal interests constituted dynamic groupings that interacted and constantly defined and redefined one another current narratological theories including those of todorov genette bakhtin and martinez bonati assist in teasing out the intertextual maneuvers and philosophical conflicts embedded in the novels of the period while the sociological and biographical material bridges the philosophical and literary analyses the result solidly grounded in original archival research is a convincingly complete picture of spain s intellectual world in the first thirty years of this century crossfire should revolutionize thinking about the generation of 98 and the generation of 14 by identifying the heterogeneous philosophical sources of each and the writers reactions to them in fiction

climate fiction and cultural analysis argues that the popularity of the term climate fiction has paradoxically exhausted the term s descriptive power and that it has developed into a black box containing all kinds of fictions which depict climatic events and has consequently lost its true significance aware of the prospect of ecological collapse as well as our apparent inability to avert it we face geophysical changes of drastic proportions that severely challenge our ability to imagine the consequences this book argues that this crisis of imagination can be partly relieved by climate fiction which may help us comprehend the potential impact of the crisis we are facing strictly assigning climate fiction to fictions that incorporate the climatological paradigm of anthropogenic global warming into their plots this book sets out to salvage the term s speculative quality it argues that climate fiction should be regarded as no less than a vital supplement to climate science because climate fiction makes visible and conceivable future modes of existence within worlds not only deemed likely by science but which are scientifically anticipated focusing primarily on english and german language fictions climate fiction and cultural analysis shows how western climate fiction sketches various affective and cognitive relations to the world in its utilization of a small number of recurring imaginaries or imagination forms this book will be of great interest to students and scholars of ecocriticism the environmental humanities and literary and culture studies more generally

alan h goldman presents an original and lucid account of the relationship between philosophy and the novel in the first part on philosophy of novels he defends theories of literary value and interpretation literary value the value of literary works as such is a species of aesthetic value goldman argues that works have aesthetic value when they simultaneously engage all our mental capacities perceptual cognitive imaginative and emotional this view contrasts with now prevalent narrower formalist views of literary value according to it cognitive engagement with novels includes appreciation of their broad themes and the theses these imply often moral and hence philosophical theses which are therefore part of the novels literary value interpretation explains elements of works so as to allow readers maximum appreciation so as to maximize the literary value of the texts as written once more goldman s view contrasts with narrower views of literary interpretation especially those which limit it to uncovering what authors intended one implication of goldman s broader view is the possibility of incompatible but equally acceptable interpretations which he explores through a discussion of rival interpretations of ernest hemingway s the sun also rises goldman goes on to test the theory of value by explaining the immense appeal of good mystery novels in its terms the second part of the book on philosophy in novels explores themes relating to moral agency moral development motivation and disintegration in jane austen s pride and prejudice mark twain s huckleberry finn john irving s the cider house rules and joseph conrad s nostromo by narrating the course of characters lives including their inner lives over extended periods these novels allow us to vicariously experience the characters moral progressions positive and negative to learn in a more focused way moral truths as we do from real life experiences
